Permanent Community Impact Fund Board (CIB) Funding Request

Project Overview

The North Tooele Fire District (NTFD) is seeking a total of \$6.5 million from the Permanent Community Impact Fund Board (CIB) to address critical infrastructure and emergency response needs within its service area. This funding will support two major projects essential to maintaining public safety and effective emergency response.

Project Components

1. Lake Point Fire Station Remodel (\$5 Million)

- **Objective:** Enhance the station's capacity to respond to emergencies along Interstate 80 (I-80) and support the growing communities of Lake Point, Stansbury Park, Erda, and Pine Canyon.
- **Improvements:** The remodel will include upgrading the station's infrastructure, expanding facilities to accommodate additional personnel and equipment, and increasing emergency response readiness. 2. Ladder Fire Truck Acquisition (\$1.5 Million)

- **Improvements:** The addition of a ladder truck will significantly improve firefighting and rescue capabilities, particularly in areas with tall buildings and complex fire scenarios. This will ensure better service coverage for both residential and commercial incidents.

Justification and Impact

The funding request reflects NTFD's commitment to addressing the increasing demands within its 1,700-square-mile jurisdiction. With growing populations, expanding residential areas, and increased commercial development, the district must upgrade its infrastructure and equipment to maintain effective emergency response.
